New Business

• Wille 465 Demo Machine for Chipman - \$148,500 plus tax and delivery Chipman Capital - \$38,520.00 and rest coming out of the capital budget for Chipman. Motion: Moved by Councillor Richardson and seconded by Councillor Mazerolle to purchase the Wille 465 Demo Machine for Chipman at a cost of \$148,500 plus tax and delivery - \$38,520 coming from Chipman Capital and the rest coming from Chipman's capital budget. Motion carried. Councillor Klassen voted against.

• Food Cycler Municipal Solutions – 2023

- > Would need a minimum of 50 households to participate in the pilot program
- ➤ 2 models to choose from 2.5L or 5.0L
- > There are discounts so that residents can pay a cheaper price
 - ❖ 2.5L is usually \$500 − resident would pay \$150
 - ❖ 5.0L is usually \$800 − resident would pay \$300
- Municipality would contribute \$100/unit subsidy in addition to the Impact Funding available for the program. The net cost to the Municipality for 50 units (of either size) would be \$5000 plus tax and shipping
- > Residents would track for 12 weeks how much they use the food cycler and how the amount of garbage they have has decreased.

➤ Way to promote lessening our waste and could leas to the Municipality paying less in tipping fees for refuse.

Motion: Moved by Councillor Mazerolle and seconded by Councillor Boudreau to contribute \$100/unit subsidy in addition to the Impact Funding available for the program with a minimum of 50 units plus shipping and tax. **Motion carried**.

Hazard Assessment – Safety Assessment

Motion: Moved by Councillor Klassen and seconded by Councillor Boudreau to proceed with the Hazard/Safety Assessment at a cost of \$6000 plus HST. **Motion carried**.

Fire Department – 3 Quotes for Gravel Pad and Excavation Work for Dry Hydrant on Route 10 in New Zion

- ➤ Jules Fasquel Ltd. Pad is 60 ft. x 70 ft. price includes shale rock to depth of 6 inches, levelled with dozer. 1 day of work with excavator digging trench for pipe \$5750
- ➤ GW Mill Contracting Ltd. Supply gravel for turning spot for fire truck and dig out line for drafting \$4140
- ➤ Emery Babineau Ltd. Hauling gravel to make turning area for truck and excavating to install piping to draft water \$4370

Motion: Moved by Deputy Mayor Smith and seconded by Councillor Mazerolle to accept the quote for GW Mills Contracting at a cost of \$3600 plus \$540 for a total of \$4140. Motion carried.

• Fleet Ready - \$899.83 plus tax

Motion: Moved by Councillor Boudreau and seconded by Councillor Richardson to accept the quote from FleetReady for the adapter, PVC pipe to adapt to a coupling or elbow at a cost of \$899.83 plus HST. **Motion carried**.

Streetlights

Moved by Councillor Boudreau and seconded by Councillor Hogg to accept streetlight plans for New Zion, along Route 10 (Heath area), Ripples, New England Road, New Avon Road, Bronson Road, and Route 10 and Thompson Road. **Motion carried**.

Flashing Light as Pleasant Drive and Post Road

Motion: Moved by Councillor Boudreau and seconded by Councillor Hogg to move forward with having a road study done to install a flashing light at Pleasant drive and Post Road (Minto end) with money being taken from the Minto Capital Reserves to cover the cost. Motion carried.

• Ball Hockey - National - Sponsorship

Motion: Moved by Councillor Richardson and seconded by Councillor Klassen to donate \$250 to sponsor the "Farm Team" at the ball hockey nationals. Deputy Mayor for, Councillors Hogg, Boudreau, Richardson, Mazerolle and Klassen voted against. **Motion defeated**.
